Surrey United Soccer Club

Surrey United Soccer was first formed in 1968 and had only six teams. In the 1970's, Surrey United pioneered the first mini soccer program that is now one of the fastest growing aspects of youth soccer. In 1997 the club was granted approval for a girls program which is growing at a fast pace. Surrey United Soccer Club provides youth soccer for boys and girls between the ages of 5 and 18 at all levels including metro, and adult soccer for both men and women. Our mission is to provide a top level organized soccer league and player development for all players at all levels. Surrey United has over 120 teams and a membership of approximately 2,400 players.

Job description

The position will be for a 36-month contractual term and will require the candidate to work flexible hours (weekend and evenings). The successful candidate will report directly to the appointed club executive. They will require a valid driving license, be computer literate (word, excel, power-point), and have excellent presentation and organizational skills. The specific details of the job are below:

- Responsible to design and all the technical programs for the club and upon approval by the executive, implement those programs within the defined budget with the intent of improving the technical skill of the players and their understanding of the laws of the game.
- Responsible to maintain relationships with the local, provincial and national coaching authorities and communicating any information to the executive.
- Assist with miscellaneous unspecified administrative duties in order to complement the day to day running of the club.
- Responsible, in conjunction, with the coaching committee for appointing all coaches and also where necessary relieving them of their duties.
- Responsible for organizing and supervising all team evaluations and selections
- Have direct and consistent (weekly) contact with the coaches of Select Level teams via the provision of game day analysis feedback, coach development, training program design, and including at times the delivery of training sessions.
- Help design, modify and implement our Surrey United Performance Academy programs.
- Design and supervise the implementation (via assistant technical staff) of appropriate level of technical development programs for the mini program, and 11-a-side gold, silver, bronze and house programs.

Minimum requirements

Minimum five (5) years experience coaching in community club based soccer programs. Minimum of a Canadian Soccer Association National 'B' License or equivalent and/or professional exposure at a high level..

Remuneration – will be based on a combination of experience and certification.
